April 28 Work Session Minutes

## Old Business

1. Tree Ordinance – discussed Mark Gorman's suggested changes in the ordinance. Chris moved to accept the ordinance as amended in sections 23.40.30 and 23.40.60. Deb seconded and it was approved. Will try to get this in the next assembly meeting (not tonight, but the next after that). That is also the assembly meeting with the arbor day proclamation. Joe will notify Gary.
2. Discussed putting out a PSA on Right Tree Right Place – Lynne will work on this.
3. Setting planting Dates:

**Crescent Tree planting:** Will have sites prepped ahead of time – May 16<sup>th</sup> at 9am. Discussed the tree planting arrangement. Decided to plant 8 trees along the roadway, spaced at least 30' apart and 15' from the road. These will have a 20 – 25' spread and 15 – 20' hgt at maturity. White blooming with bright green leaves. They have blossoms first, for a showy effect.

**Baranof planting:** Cleaning up and refurbishing. Pruning, mulching, soil improvement, weeding, adding six Miss Kim Lilacs along with some ferns. Also spring bulbs added in the fall. Later in the summer.

4. Centennial Hall

Monique made changes based on our remarks: cherry for katsura, added flowering quince, more color and different timing on Rhodys, changed clematis for kiwi (edible – leaves are variegated white/pink/green)

5. Seawalk

There is some money held back from the planting because of issues and so more plants will be added where the planting is sparse. Viking Aronia (color in the fall) , Quince, Sea Berries will be added. Cannot locate honey berries, that we wanted to use.

6. The Grid

Site Improvements include straightening bullrail, cleaning, bench, add supplemental soils, planting (two alternatives), Blue and Red Currants, Thimbleberries, Yew, River Birch, vine Maple, along with some rocks. The goal is to plant low maintenance.
