Dear Amy and Roberta,

I was in the office today submitting my use fees and partial application. I just emailed my insurance provider to get insurance set up in place for activities at Baranof Warm Springs.

The rest of my application is in this email. Please pardon my lack of technological skills in providing this.

#### Description Checklist:

- 1. The location we would like to use would be Baranof Warm Springs proper. Meaning the boardwalk, natural tubs, and the trail to the lake from Warm Springs proper.
- We will be transporting guests aboard the M/V Northern Song, an 85 ft. Expedition Yacht. We will be anchoring in Warm Springs Bay and tendering our clients into the dock. Our tender is a small 18 ft Rigid Bottom Inflatable skiff.
- 3. Our group's size is small. 6 to 8 guests with one to two guides.
- 4. Our time of usage will be June, July, and August 2024. We do not stop every week as if the weather is good, we do not typically stop in there, we usually stop when the weather is rough or windy and we need to duck in somewhere of interest. Our typical time of day to be there is mid-morning to early afternoon.
- 5. Our clients use the restroom on the vessel. We pack in and pack out what we bring in (water bottels), which is minimal. No garbage will be left on site. All guides have backpacks for all guest needs. Our Clients are versed in emergency evacuations on board the vessel before departure and before going to the beach. We are very strict about this as we do not want to get a client into a situation where they cannot make it back out from a beach expedition.
- 6. All guides have CPR training, ASMI cold water training, and Wilderness One training. We are all also versed in AED training and have an AED aboard the vessel. All guides also carry a VHF radio which we stand by on channel 74. We also carry Bear Spray and are versed in Bear Avoidance as we all grew up in SE. Alaska.
- 7. Alaska Sea Adventures operates solely as Alaska Sea Adventures, we do not have contracts with other vessels or companies. We are small and independently owned. By myself Harley Ethelbah. We also do not charge our clients for this experience other than the cost of the cruise with us aboard the Northern Song.
- The USCG Documentation number for the Northern Song is, 1036431, Our tender Vessel AK # is AK3438AL

I have a great relationship with a few residents in Warm Springs and have visited there since I was a youth. I know the area well. We treat it with respect as we love it there.

Thank you for reviewing my permit.

Please let me know if there is anything else you may need from me as far as paperwork. I look forward to hearing from you.





M/Y LIVA plans to park outside of Baranof Warm Springs Bay. The yacht is 118m in length and will remain on the outside due to her size. LIVA will utilize her tender in order to run all 11 guests and 1 crew member to the dock. Once the guests and the crew member are dropped off then the tender will return to the yacht and remain tied up during the guest's activities on shore.

The guests will utilize the board walk for photo opportunities and to experience the community of Baranof Warm Springs. If they choose them may utilize the trail (board walk and rock/dirt mix) to walk up to the lake for a second photo opportunity. They will return to the yacht using the same trail. Time on shore is estimated at under 2 hours.

The main purpose of the stop is to give the guests the opportunity to experience a rural Southeast Alaska community and take photos of the beautiful scenery.

  - M/Y LIVA will remain on the outside of Baranof Warm Springs Bay. LIVA's crew will run the tender with the guests into the dock and then the tender will return to the yacht to be tied up until the guests are ready for pick up.
- Estimate number of participants and/or group size.
   12 passengers

- d. Time of desired usage. July 5<sup>th</sup> or 6<sup>th</sup> 2024 itinerary dependent but it will be one of these two days. We anticipate being ashore for 1-2 hours max likely in the late morning to early afternoon between 10am to 1pm on either July 5<sup>th</sup> or 6<sup>th</sup>.
- e. Plans for restroom accommodations, litter control, emergency evacuation, & clientele safety briefing.

All guests will be briefed that there are no restrooms available shoreside. They will use the restroom before going ashore. If they need to use the restroom once on land then the crew member responsible for the group will call the ship's radio and request a pick up for the guest at the dock. No littering will take place. Food will not be brought ashore. Guests will be given a bear safety and hike briefing before any shoreside activities. The guests will be restricted to the trail and will mainly be taking photos of the waterfall and surrounding scenery. The crew member responsible for operating the tender will remain on watch during the guest's shoreside experience. In the event of an emergency, the crew will hail the bridge team via the ships radio channel and request a tender pick up immediately at the dock.

Crew members all have extensive tender/boating experience worldwide in various elements. All crew have STCW certifications and chief tender drivers operate under a yacht master certificate.

#### Description checklist:

a. Location and explanation of proposed use, including maps.

Use is requested (as per previous permit) for Baranof Warm Springs only. Custom Alaska Cruises has visited BWS for over 30 years and hopes to continue to do so. We will conduct once a week visits from June 1-Sept 15. Visits will consist of taking 8 guests to the warm springs for approximately 2-hour visits. We work to avoid times when other groups are using the springs. We anchor away from the dock to limit congestion and monitor for when it looks like the least busy time to visit the springs. We hike to the springs with eight clients and one naturalist/guide. Guide is versed in our safety and leave no trace protocols. Tender drops clients and returns to the big boat while guests on shore, again limiting dock congestion. We prefer to anchor around the corner to create more privacy. BWS has been a central focus of Custom Alaska Cruises trips for many years, and we understand the need now for working together with other groups and users. Gone are the days when we would have the dock to ourselves for a whole day. We stive to create the best experience not just for our guests but other users as well. Captains reduce vessels to an idle when entering Warm Springs Bay to reduce wake activity for other users/lodges.

b. Description of transportation to site, including mode of transportation and plan for client parking.

Clients arrive in BWS aboard one of two vessels (never both at same time) then a 16' inflatable tender takes clients to and from the mothership to the dock. For the 2024 season use will only be conducted aboard the M/Y Golden Eagle. M/V Sikumi will not be operating summer of 2024.

c. Estimate number of participants and/or group size.

8 guest/1 guide

d. Time of desired usage.

One visit per week June 1-Sept 15

e. Plans for restroom accommodations, litter control, emergency evacuation, & clientele safety briefing.

Clients are encouraged to use facilities on the vessel prior to heading to shore. No human waste will be left on shore. Litter will be removed by guides/staff. We have USCG and USFS approved emergency plans in place for all situations. Clients receive a pre-trip as well as a daily safety briefing from captain and guides. Custom Alaska Cruises is "green certified" and we are proud of our leave no trace skills. We ask our staff and guests to remove trash/litter not produced by us. As a lifelong Alaskan I appreciate all efforts to keep our home a pristine, clean environment. All trash/waste is stored in USCG approved manner aboard the vessels and removed in port of call and disposed of properly.

f. Training requirements for personnel conducting transport and tour activities.

All personnel conducting vessel operations are licensed USCG captains and maintain all necessary endorsements, qualifications and training. Guides are versed in back country safety, bear safety, first aid and CPR.

Having visited BWS myself for over 30+ years I appreciate the safety concerns and requirements for using this area.

- Provide some understanding of how the Wilderness Act of 1964 and the Alaska National Interest Lands Conservation Act of 1980 affect management of the wilderness areas on the Tongass National Forest for your clients. Examples of how wilderness is managed differently than other National Forest Lands should be a part of the message.
- Interpret natural processes, historic and cultural facts, and wilderness ethics for your clients. You encourage clients to seek more information by having reading materials either with you in the field, accessible in your place of business, or available by reference. Also, natural conditions and processes are allowed to shape your clients experience, rather than providing only for the ease and convenience of your clients.
- Follow and promote leave-no-trace principles and practices (see www.int.org)
- Provide a wilderness experience by adhering to the group sizes agreed to in the operating plan and by remaining a respectful distance away from other users whenever possible.

Describe below how you will inform your clients about wilderness values, leave-no-trace skills, and backcountry etiquette:

Before we take our clients out for a hike on National Forest System lands we have a safety and awareness briefing and discussion about the proper etiquette in the Tongass National Forest. All clients have been provided the opportunity to read informational brochures and literature as a resource guide such as Leave No Trace booklets as well as "What Can I Do In Wilderness? Alaska National Interest Lands Conservation Act and Wilderness on National Forests in Alaska" to enrich their knowledge and appreciation of the Alaskan Wilderness. Leave No Trace practices will be discussed with clients as part of every client orientation/safety briefing. Clients will be advised of the proper techniques for camping, hiking, garbage and human waste disposal, respecting wildlife, and the use of fire, as described in the "Leave No Trace — Outdoor Skills and Ethics" brochures.

All refuse will be packed out. No trash or food waste will be buried.

Any historic or prehistoric items will be left untouched if discovered and immediate contact will be made with the Forest Service.

We will comply with the agreed group size and service days as well as respecting other uses whenever possible.

Description of proposed commercial recreational activities on City and Borough lands.

a. Location and explanation of proposed use, including maps.
 Locations: Warm Springs Bay – Baranof



Map 1. Baranof, Warm Springs Bay. Proposed use area on shore consists of the area between the dock and boardwalk, to the Warm Springs and, depending on conditions, to the closest shore of Baranof Lake.

Proposed Use: Boating, marine mammal watching, birding, visit to the Hamlet of Warm Springs Bay, the hot springs, a short nature walk to Baranof Lake, and possible use of the public bathhouses, if available.

 Description of transportation to site, including mode of transportation and plan for client parking.

Clients will be transported to the general location aboard our ship the M.V Swell. M.V Swell is an 88-foot historic tugboat that has been restored and now operates as a passenger vessel. The Swell can anchor in Warm Springs Bay, approximately 120 feet (or 2-3 nautical cables) from the waterfall. Once it comes time to go ashore, clients will be loaded onto two 18-foot, white Zodiac Tenders for shore landing. These vessels can be moored at dock space if available, but are also fully equipped to anchor off, or return to the Swell if appropriate.

c. Estimate number of participants and/or group size.

We pride ourselves on operating small group excursions, so the maximum number of clients at any one time is 12. We have a crew of 5, so the maximum number of people at any one time would be 17; however, typically only 2-3 crew members will leave the vessel at one time.

### d. Time of desired usage.

Our vessel is in Alaska between July 3 and August 30, 2024. Our anticipated dates in Warm Springs Bay are July 9, July 17, July 27, August 13, August 21. Please note that these dates are subject to change should there be adverse weather conditions, but that we would never be in the area for more than 1 day per trip, for approximately 2.5 hours on shore.

 e. Plans for restroom accommodations, litter control, emergency evacuation, & clientele safety briefing.

Restroom Accommodations: The ship is anchored close by during shore trips. Guests are easily transported to the ship to use the on-board facilities if necessary. In emergency situations there are heavy Ziploc bags and toilet paper in the shore bag and all human waste and paper is removed and brought to disposal facilities on the ship. Human waste on the ship goes into the black water holding tank and through the black water treatment plant aboard that treats all blackwater and then holds discharges treated product in deep water.

Litter Control: Wastes are compacted for disposal or recycling at trip staging areas. All waste created during the trip is stored on board and recycled or composted at ports during trip turnarounds (Sitka, Ketchikan, Prince Rupert). We believe strongly in Leave No Trace ethics and principles, always adhering to these principles and briefing our guests before going ashore.

Emergency Evacuation: We are well equipped and train frequently to prepare for a potential emergency evacuation. On board Swell are marine DSC-VHF radios x 2, 3 handheld VHF units, satellite email/voice communication system (Starlink), an EPIRB and a ship cell phone. All systems have redundancy built in. For example, we have two back-up radios, as well as the ability to switch to backup battery power. Our emergency battery is kept in the wheelhouse, as opposed to the engine room. Our total backup battery power is equivalent to 12 hours, as required to be annually certified by Transport Canada.

Aboard the ship we have the following emergency equipment:

- Medical Emergency Trauma kit
- Galley first aid kit (small wounds)
- Shore Excursion first aid kit (kept in "Shore Bag" described below), oxygen, and spare tank
- Stretcher and spine board
- Automatic Electronic Defibrillator (AED)

When we take clients ashore, we always carry a shore bag which contains the following: a first aid kit with epi pens, AED, rescue splints, emergency snacks, insulating tarps and a saw. Guides also always carry ship to shore radios and on longer distance shore trips guides will have a long-range VHF radio.

Clientele Safety: Our standard client briefings include all those listed below under "Ship Safety", as well as additional safety briefings for individual shore excursions, which are based on the unique conditions and circumstances at each location visited. Our Master and crew are all experienced and trained in shore excursions and marine activities and hold all applicable certifications required by their industry. We also do not serve alcohol before or during shore excursions, to help maintain client alertness, safety, and to foster positive and respectful group dynamics.

Ship Safety: Upon boarding the ship, an extensive "Safety Aboard" briefing is delivered to guests by the Master and crew to train them in the unlikely event of an emergency. This includes:

- How to safely board the ship from a dock or from a zodiac
- How to move around the ship including where appropriate hand holds are
- Location of all safety equipment
- Muster station location
- Role of guests in emergencies fire, man overboard, abandon ship, taking on water
- Lifejacket demonstration
- When necessary, guests are part of safety drills in a passenger capacity.

Bear Safety: Maple Leaf Adventures is one of the founding members of the Commercial Bear Viewing Association (CBVA) of B.C. and is a strong proponent of educating all guides in proper guiding, safety and procedures when working in bear habitat. All groups proceeding ashore are briefed on bear safety before they leave the ship. Guests are always accompanied by CBVA BC certified guides who carry bear spray in case of a dangerous encounter with a bear. The groups are instructed to make a normal amount of noise to give the bears advanced warning of our approach and to stay together. Sustainability: MLA has received a gold standard for Green Tourism business. We practice 'leave no trace' and regenerative tourism and are very light in our footprint on the land. We follow Wilderness Tourism Association of BC's pledge to protect wilderness spaces. We do not collect any materials nor disturb the shore in any way other than walking. When we encounter ocean plastics or other garbage on shore, we use the opportunity to educate our guests on pollution and conduct a beach clean-up as a group. We are acutely aware of the surrounding natural habitat and are aware of where to and not to walk to protect the natural habitat. f. Training requirements for personnel conducting transport and tour activities.

All crew hold valid certification as required by Transport Canada to operate in the marine environment. This includes a Master 150 Gross Tonnage or higher ticket, with all required survival craft, mechanical, navigation, radio, and First Aid certifications. Our tender operators have at minimum a Small Vessel Operators Permit, and associated survival, first aid and radio operations certifications. Our guides and naturalists possess first aid certification and are certified in Bear Viewing best practices by the Commercial Bear Viewing Association of British Columbia.

g. Schedule of fees/charges to clients and a description of any collection, disbursement, royalty, commission or similar arrangements with other tour brokers, agents, or cruise ship companies.

The fee structure for this expedition is an all-inclusive 11-day trip aboard our vessel, and is inclusive of all food, beverage, professional guiding services, transportation, and accommodation aboard our vessel. The non-refundable fees are dependent on type of accommodation selected, starting at \$12050.00 CAD, and are paid in full, directly to Maple Leaf Adventures, at least 120 days prior to the trip start date. Commission arrangements are rare circumstances in which we partner with tour operators or travel agents for an individual booking.
