^{*} On Election Day, a paper jam occurred in both precinct tabulators. In precinct #1, the voter chose not to get a new ballot. The Precinct Chair placed the ballot in a secure location to be counted on October 7. In precinct #2, the jammed ballot was not counted. Another ballot was not counted due to ambigous marks which the Canvass Board discovered during routine audit. The Canvass Board reprocessed all precinct #2 ballots twice through the tabulator, confirmed totals, which are presented above. There are no substantial changes to the unofficial results for the Municipal Regular Election posted on October 4, 2022.

If approved by a majority of qualified voters, this amendment will become effective January 1, 2023. The net effect of approval of the ballot proposition exempting marijuana and marijuana products from general sales tax and creating the marijuana and marijuana specific sales tax would be a zero to one percent increase in taxes in the first year, and a two to three percent increase for the second year and all subsequent years, depending on the time of the year the tax is collected.
