I now work for the Baranof Island Housing Authority. I like to volunteer, and have served on several boards in Australia, and in Sitka. In my first year as a Sitka resident, I served on the City and Borough of Sitka's Solid Waste Advisory Committee, and later served as a board member for the Sitka Community Land Trust.

In the past three years, we have provided opportunities for the community to learn more about energy efficient technology (Electrification Expo events held in 2023 and 2024) and partnered with the Sitka Local Food Network to complete the second edition of the Sitka Community Food Assessment. The same partnership is also working on Sitka's first large scale community garden.
